



August has been a busy month with multiple events. In early August I attended a three-day 50-year reunion of Coast Guard Group Cape May SAR (Search and Rescue). Approximately 75 small-boat operators, lightship sailors, and lighthouse tenders attended under clear blue skies, warm temperatures, and cool salty ocean breezes—nothing could be more perfect for us.

The gas was fully drained, radiator installed, carbs reattached, and new gas added to the tank prior to turning the engine over after sitting idle for three years. Antifreeze and oil were added, and with the coil wire disconnected, the engine was cranked over until oil pressure was built up and fully flowed through the new oil filter.


We then installed a new coil and condenser and dressed the points. After a few pumps of the gas pedal, the engine coughed to life, abetted by a little coaxing of the throttle and choke. We were all proud of the results. There are still things to be addressed, but the basics have been completed.

Until next year, keep 'em rolling and keep the rubber side down!





