THE PHILADELPHIA REGION



Six months of anticipation has finally led to the realization of Healeys on Hallowed Ground in Gettysburg. We arrived on Sunday afternoon, and were greeted by Ray and Lois in British-flag vests. Thanks need to go out to everyone involved in planning and implementing a tremendous undertaking.

The film and cyclorama at the Welcome Reception at the Gettysburg National Military Park Museum and Visitors Center were excellent. The film was a powerful evocation of the Gettysburg experience. The cyclorama, created by French artist Paul Philippoteaux in 11 months, was spectacular in its depiction of the battlefields. The museum itself presented interesting artifacts and information.

I did relay to General Lee that one of General Meade's early assignments as an engineer was still standing as a sentinel in guiding mariners into the Delaware Bay waters. Brandywine Shoal Lighthouse was constructed in 1850 by then Lt. Meade to guide ships past the shallow shoals that had claimed many vessels. It had been fitted at Lt. Meade's direction with a third-order Fresnel lens in 1851 to increase the brightness of the light.

Monday brought the Rally and the wine tasting and tour at the Adams County Winery. There were brisk sales of the good wine tasted there. We had dinner in the quaint town of Gettysburg that evening.

On Tuesday we saw a powerful film at the Gateway Theater, which presented an insightful view of the threeday battle. The guided Battlefield Bus Tour was exceptionally well done by knowledgeable guides who were able to answer questions and give additional insight to the battles, both Blue and Gray. We saw a Memorial with an eternal flame that was built with stone from both Alabama and Maine, among other monuments. When we stood with the guide at the battle sites, we could more accurately imagine both the horror and courage of those three days. We will never forget it. We were impressed with the fact that the Park Service is restoring the battlefield landscape to the way it looked in 1863.

The Enclave 2015 BBQ that evening was delicious, and the auction, with proceeds going to the Fisher House Charity, was very successful.

The Popular Car Show the next day was very well attended, with approximately 300 cars. It was wonderful to see so many beautiful Healeys all together.

Unfortunately, we had to leave after the car show to attend a family event, but we are sure that other members of our club and other clubs will be able to describe events on Wednesday afternoon and Thursday. I must say that Marlyn and I thoroughly enjoyed ourselves, and look forward to next year's events. **#**



Our Planning Committee of 3 representatives from the Philly Region of AHSTC and 3 representatives from the New England Region of the AHCA had spent countless hours going over every detail, every day's event, everything we could anticipate given our combined experiences at past Encounters and Conclaves. Now it was show time. What might go wrong? What did we forget? How well could we adapt on the fly? Would the weather Gods be kind? Having never run an Encounter, much less a combined meet triple the size, I had trepidations but was convinced that we could pull off a memorable event. With the focus and can do attitudes possessed by Trish Woglom and Leo Kob as well as the same commitment from our New England partners, I was confident that our extensive planning efforts would pay off.




the Kiddiekhana;

- Observing a detailed Concours judging of 100's, a 100M, BJ8's, a 100-6 and Bugeye's;
- Enjoying the great food at our closing banquet where more than 130 awards were given to the attendees for their cars and their talents; and
- Meeting old, and making new, friends throughout a week of fun and informative festivities.

A meet of this size could not have been successfully executed without the helping efforts of many. Trish Woglom kept us organized, while Leo Kob worked in the background with signage, staging and back of the house coordination. Our New England partners, led by Pete Sturtevant, were in lock step with our club members every step of the way in supporting all of the activities. 




