
Joe also announced at the Banquet that the Harrisburg Region officers remain as follows:





n October 30, 10 Healeys and 23 members drove to the Castle Valley Mill in Doylestown. PA, for a tour of the flour grinding and milling facility. The Mill is presently operated as a working flour mill distributing their products to various stores and restaurants in the Greater Philadelphia area. The owners, Mark and Fran Fischer, inherited the old mill from Mark's grandfather and decided to reopen the 1800s mill as an active producer. We were shown around the mill operations which are still maintained in the old method of grinding with wheel and stone to produce flours. Quite a few early patented products were employed in the original mill and have been

restored to their original specifications. The grain is moved employing an Archimedes mechanism. Also employed is an elevator system to move the grain between the various levels of the building.

The weather was perfect for Healey driving, with sunny skies and temperature in the mid-70s. The Neshaminy Creek runs alongside the mill, complete with waterfalls and makes a most picturesque setting. We sat outside and enjoyed scones, coffee and conversation before and after the tour. After the tour, we drove about one-half hour over back

roads in Bucks County to the Pineville Tavern where we enjoyed a delicious lunch and camaraderie.

As the weather turned more towards winter with temperatures in the 30s and winds in the 40s, a few members braved the high winds and drove to Pour Richards' Coffee House *pourrichardscoffee.com/* in Devon, Pa. The Shop is owned by fellow member Rich Berman who had brought the idea of using the Coffee House as a rendezvous point. We were treated to fresh brewed coffee, cakes and met the artist George Rothaker and his terrific paintings of cars displayed on the walls.

Our monthly meeting was held at the Metropolitan Restaurant in Montgomeryville on Nov. 21, with 17 members attending. After a great meal we discussed our trip to the Castle Valley Mill. are constantly battling. John wanted to prove to his good friend Mike (who had purchased the car unseen on e-bay) that even though the car was in less than pristine condition it could make the round trip ride.

After over 350,000 miles the car is still running and bringing hope to cancer children around the country. John receives a call from someone who needs hope and off he goes to bring a smile to the child's face. Children want to see it, feel it and even drive it and thus get a feeling there is indeed hope in their times of despair.

Grace will be on display at Simeone for the winter while she is put back into driving condition and hopefully will bring smiles and cheers from children for quite some time.









Now we can look forward to the post-holiday party on January 15th!



TAKING OFF AND PUTTING ON THE DUST COVER —By Joe SpearS

Here's how to take off the dust cover once it's on:

- Take it out from under the front bumper and in big loops roll the dust over the bonnet (lifting it over the aerial) so it rests on the roof/on the seats when the top is down.
- Take it out from under the back bumper and roll it over the boot so that the rear half is on top of the front half on the roof/on the seats.
- Fold up the driver's side up so the crease is where the window and top meet or to the passenger door if the top is down.
- Repeat on the passenger side.
- Standing at the passenger door, lift the folded top off the top/the seats and place it on top of a flat surface.

When you are ready to put the dust cover back on backtrack.

- Pick up the top exactly as you laid it down.
- Put it on top of the car/seats on the passenger side.
- Unfold the passenger side.
- Unfold the driver's side
- Unfold the rear and tuck it under the bumper.
- Unfold the front and tuck it under the bumper.
