

# What's In The Flash

**W**ow what a Healey year! *The Flash* year is over with this November issue and we hope you enjoyed it.

If you do have an idea of a "winter project" you want to do this year, send it to me as I would like to compile a list and tell the members about possible ideas for them to think about.

For me this year it will be the exhaust system. Pulling it off the car, painting it outside and installing better heat shields between it and the floorboards.

Also, Eastwood is selling a new "Internal" high temp paint/coating that you spray inside the exhaust pipes to "keep the heat inside the pipe". Yep, inside the pipe with a 24" flexible plastic hose/ nozzle. I tried it on my boat exhaust pipes and is adhered will and could protect the pipes from rusting internally.


## Fall Tour Report






### **Hershey Fall AACA Nationals - October 9 to the 12**

I traveled to Hershey in perfect weather. Parking this year at Hershey was \$15.

My first stop was the car corral. A nice Nash Healey car #209, chassis 2296 was for sale in the car coral at Hershey. It was described as a Texas car and an original survivor but with engine replacement in the 60's. Also in the description was NHA 1186. The car was just out of 45 year storage and recommissioned in Texas by Larry Lawrence, 903-563-0135. Asking price was \$54,900 or offer. LBI had a nice golden Beige 3000 for sale at their vendor location for \$95,000. It had been restored by BRC Motors and included a 5 speed transmission. They also had a very nice blue, outside bonnet latch, welded louver XKE for which the asking price was not given. These early XKEs are selling in the \$300,000 to \$425,000 range.

### **Brits at the Village – October 12**

The Philadelphia MG Club, Inc. held there annual car show at Peddler's Village, in Lahaska. I drove EJ's 1972 Triumph TR6 to the show. The entrance fee at the gate was \$20. I counted seven big Healeys and George Crombie's Sprite on the show field.

Healey owners that I recognized were Dave Siwa, Randy Alkins, Wayne Kachel and Carol and Joe Bardon. Dave's 1963 Healey was in the Premier class for winners from last year's show.



## *Under the Boards – The Final Chapter to 'Driving the Board's in Ocean City, NJ'*




