


I can rely on. Next up? My wife noticed that the brake lights don't work now. I'm hoping that will be a simpler fix than the stopping issue was! Time to test drive!

Undeterred, I called Joe directly in hopes of learning more about the mysterious photograph. In response, Joe sent me other pictures from the auto show and described the history of owning and restoring his car.

The collection also included a huge antique farm tractor that Joe fondly remembers having driven as a kid. A Ford Model T was the first classic car Joe ever drove.

Joe and his wife Nancy fell in love with the sleek lines and the Austin Healey

3000, and they even bought a Matchbox model of the car. The couple set about the process of finding and acquiring the fullsize version of the vehicle. In his usual thorough fashion, Joe began by reading a reference book on how to buy a used Healey. He even prepared a four-page check list of known potential issues common to the model. After searching across the region, a possible target car with only 40K miles was finally located in New Jersey. The woman who was selling the car recalled her father restoring the








AUCTION REPORT

As I mentioned in What's in the Flash, I am only featuring one car this month because it is a very interesting auction story, and lesson in my view, on the characteristics of the on-line auction process (not unique to Bring a Trailer).

The car in question is a fairly well known 100M, with previous ownership by well-known Healey experts. Yet it didn't meet its reserve (RNM) in 4 attempts on Bring a Trailer (BaT) as follows:

March 2020 – RNM \$127,500 January 2021 – RNM \$104,000

May 2024 - RNM \$105,000

August 2024 - RNM \$100,500

BaT refers to cars that have been previously offered on their website as "Alumni Cars". While I don't follow every BaT auction, for the ones I do, I have noticed that Alumni cars rarely do better the second time around. This car seems to support that, admittedly subjective, observation. That is one of the downsides, in my view, of the on-line auction process. A value mindset gets established from which its difficult for future bidders to stray.

The other on-line auction characteristic, which is a two-edged sword, is the ability for anyone to weigh in on the quality of the car. This always makes for interesting reading but can be either helpful to the seller or prospective buyers, or not. This car had both very positive and negative comments and, as always with 100Ms, the authenticity gets enormous scrutiny.

In my view this is a beautiful car and is almost certainly a 100M, albeit now with some notable replacement parts. I won't comment on the value or the outcome, which I will leave to you, the readers.

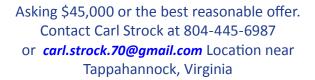
