

#### **ENCOUNTER 2024**

had booked reservations at the Flanders Holtel in Ocean City, NJ for Tuesday – Thursday for Encounter. The car show was scheduled to be on the boardwalk on Wednesday at noon. I wanted to be present.

The Saturday before, I put the top on the car. Anyone that knows about the 1958 Austin Healey knows what a chore that is. I had a hard time with one of the rear clips (my car has a bar inside the top that fits into two C-clips). One of the clips barely caught and I left for the 125-mile drive with it "as is".

While driving on the Garden State Parkway, about 30 miles into the trip, the other clip came loose. I didn't want to stop because I knew it would be a half-hour project. I continued to drive. The top started to rattle, shake and blow in the wind. After a few more miles, one turnbuckle and one Tenax fastener came loose. There I was with half of the top on and the other half off. The top was still fastened, and I drove the last 85 miles not knowing if the top would blow off. I finally arrived at the Flanders parking lot, looked at what had actually occurred, and fixed it in about 45 seconds!

I arrived at about 1pm. As I drove to check in at the hotel, I met Tom and Pam Mulligan. They informed me that the show had been changed from Wednesday to Tuesday and that it was going on now, and that the cars had a police escort onto the boardwalk. If I went to the boardwalk entrance, about a half mile away, I thought I might be able to join them.

When I arrived at the boardwalk there were no cars there. I opted to drive onto the boardwalk and join the group. I didn't expect to find 250 people in front of me on the boardwalk. At the 2019 Ocean City Encounter it was a short drive to where the cars were parked for the show. This time the jaunt was over a half mile. I was driving at walking speed, about 2-3 miles per hour, People were courteous and allowed me to pass. Finally, I arrived where the show was taking place and parked behind the last car, an MGTD.

I saw a space in the Austin Healey section and moved there. Then I noticed that all the cars had placards on their windshields. I asked where to get one and was told that I would get mine when I checked in for Encounter at the hotel. I walked about ¾ of a mile back to the hotel, registered, and walked back to the car. For the next few hours, I expected the police to return. At the end of the show all the cars were escorted off the boardwalk by the police at the front and at the rear of the procession. I expected one of the officers to point at me and pull me over as I exited the show. My exit was uneventful. I was lucky.

HSTC Lehigh Valley Region was well represented by members Joe McGavin and Bob Snyder who dominated this year's America's British Reliability Run held over the weekend of October 18 through 20, 2024. This long running, well-known annual charity event brings together the best in classic British automobiles. Each year organizers choose a different charity focus. This year, donations went to support the Shriners Hospital for Children in Philadelphia.

Joe McGavin took control while driving his beautiful 1967 Austin Healey 3000 MK III called Big Blue. It turned out that this year, his was the only Healey to participate, perhaps a shame since Healeys appear to have been well represented in previous years, seemingly peppering the field in old photographs. (Hint: Come on members, show off your car in next year's run.)

Bob Snyder was also on board this year in Big Blue's side seat. Bob is Vice President of our AHSTC Lehigh Valley Region. Bob took on the challenging job of navigating Big Blue through


All proceeds raised by participants and sponsorship donations went into supporting replacement of a specialized orthopedic X-Ray machine at Shriners Children's Hospital in Philadelphia. This new high precision, low radiation X-ray machine will provide joint imaging, full body scanning and expanded bone and joint assessment much like a CT scan.

# AUCTION REPORT

We have two very different Austin Healeys this month. One is a 1956 100, sold on Bring a Trailer (BaT) and the other is an unusual 1966 3000 sold on the lesser-known on-line auction site Pcarmarket. The 3000 is a very interesting, highly modified rally car that perhaps you have seen before either in person or in magazines.

First let's look at the 1956 100 BN2 roadster with the Le Mans kit installed, which sold for \$82,950 including the buyer's premium (BP). This car appears to have been offered by well-known classic car dealer Hyman LTD, who is a frequent BaT participant. The car appears to be in very good condition; however, it wears dark blue paint with a cream interior rather than its original two-tone black/red with a red interior. The Le Mans kit was installed under prior ownership.

Last month I commented on the pricing tiers for 100's and this sale seems to fall in line with a Le Mans kit (nonfactory) modified car. The non original colors didn't seem to hurt it a bit. The comments were mostly positive, and you can read them here

# **AUCTION REPORT**

Next is a very interesting 1966 turbocharged, fuel-injected 3000 MKIII rally car. This car is not for everyone, but you must admire the work that went into building this car. I have seen this car before, either in photos from an event or in a magazine, and I was struck by it then.

Pcarmarket operates much like BaT, with a similar format and fee structure. However, it tends to cater to more modern enthusiast cars. It is dominated by Porsches, although the diversity of its offerings seems to be expanding.

Perhaps this wasn't the best venue for this highly specialized car as it was bid to \$45k and didn't meet the reserve. However, Pcarmarket offers the car, at the conclusion of the bidding, with a "buy it now" price of \$85k. This is an indication of how far off the bidding was from the reserve.

Also, this car was offered on Pcarmarket in February 2023 and was bid to \$75k at that time and did not meet the reserve. I've said before, the first offer is rarely exceeded in subsequent auction attempts.

Regardless of the auction results, this is a very interesting car and it's worth reading about and exploring all the modifications. I love the look of the 17" wire wheels! Check it out here.


