



# Tech Tips & Clips

## THE MUCH-MALIGNED ARCHIMEDES SCREW


Every Big Healey comes with an Archimedes screw machined into the rear of the crankshaft. Oil moving along crank encounters the screw and is moved backwards to fall into the oil pan. This device was first described by Archimedes after he visited Egypt in 234BC and saw how it was used to move water uphill. It is still used in many industrial applications today.

The screw works well when the engine is running but when the car is parked with the rear lower than the front, it will likely leave a small spot of oil. My interest in explaining the Archimedes screw as it pertains to Healeys was brought on by a question a Long Island member had about this kind of oil spotting. His mechanic's suggestion was to install a modern oil seal with a coiled spring to keep tight against the rotating shaft. This installation would not be cheap since either the transmission or the engine would need to be removed. Long ago I had my engine pulled out for a rebuild and planned to install a modern oil seal in the main rear bearing position. Well, as often happens, I was running out of time. The Long Island Region had agreed to rent Bridgehampton Racetrack for a weekend. The date was rapidly approaching. Not only would I need to assemble the engine, reinstall it in the car, get it running, but also break it in before abusing it on the racetrack. Something had to go. No more modern rear seal, Archimedes would remain. I have never regretted that decision.

Now back to our Long Island member's story. Every year when he drives his BJ8 for its annual oil change, he gets this same story, and I advise him not to do it. This year I asked him, "How many miles are on your car?" he replies, "60,000." He is the second owner. It comes back to me that he bought it in 1969 from the original owner. Every Long Island member and British car mechanic that I have related this story to agrees with me: Don't do it.

If you had to do a clutch replacement or remove the transmission for some reason, you could entertain doing the seal job.

I googled installing the kit for the rear main seal and there were some people saying it didn't help all that much. Maybe it was not installed correctly or maybe the oil on the garage floor was from somewhere else: a leaky valve cover gasket, for instance. That would be much cheaper to replace than installing the kit for the rear main seal. Some other possibilities are worn rocker arm bushings and rocker shaft. That allows too much oil to be moving around in the valve cover. When the engine is running, take a peek with a flashlight in the oil filler with the cap off. It should reveal weeping of oil from the rocker arm that you can see, and not oil shooting all over. Your seal on the timing chain cover at the front of the engine could

be leaking, as the modern oil seal with the neoprene rubber after high mileage will wear a groove in the cast iron crankshaft.

In conclusion, there are many reasons that could be causing the oil leak (and I haven't even covered them all) but the Archimedes screw, or scroll as it is sometimes called will always be doing its job as well as the day it was made.



This month we have two very nice examples of both the Sprite and the “Big Healey”. Both sold very well, and close to market correct for the top of the market cars, in my opinion, but each will leave you feeling quite different about how they achieved their respective results.

The two cars are a *1960 Bugeye* and a rare *1961 3000 BN7 two-seater*. Both sold in October on Bring a Trailer (BaT). Let's look at the Bugeye first, which is what BaT refers to as an “Alumni Car”. This is a car that previously sold on BaT and is now offered again. I have talked about these cars in past reports and pointed out that cars rarely sell for more as an alumnus (or alumna if you think of cars as female!) for reasons I won't go into again here. This very lovely Bugeye sold for \$22k in May of 2018. The current seller spent \$29k refurbishing the car and then sold it in October of 2025 for – wait for it – \$22k (all sale prices include the buyer's premium).
